
# HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

# SAFEGUARDING

The NSPCC's Pantosaurus campaign helps parents talk to children about staying safe using five simple "PANTS" rules: Privates are private – the parts covered by swimwear belong only to them; Always remember your body belongs to you – no one should make them feel uncomfortable; No means no – children have the right to say no to unwanted touch, even from family; Talk about secrets that upset you – good secrets are fun, but bad secrets that make you sad or worried should always be shared with a trusted adult; and Speak up, someone can help – if they ever feel sad, anxious, or frightened, they should talk to an adult they trust, like a parent or teacher. The campaign uses a friendly dinosaur, Pantosaurus, and songs and resources to make these important conversations easy and reassuring for children.
